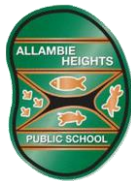
How good were the school photos? Can you believe the people above take care of your children... no wonder we have so much fun at Arranounbai every day!

International Day of People with Disability

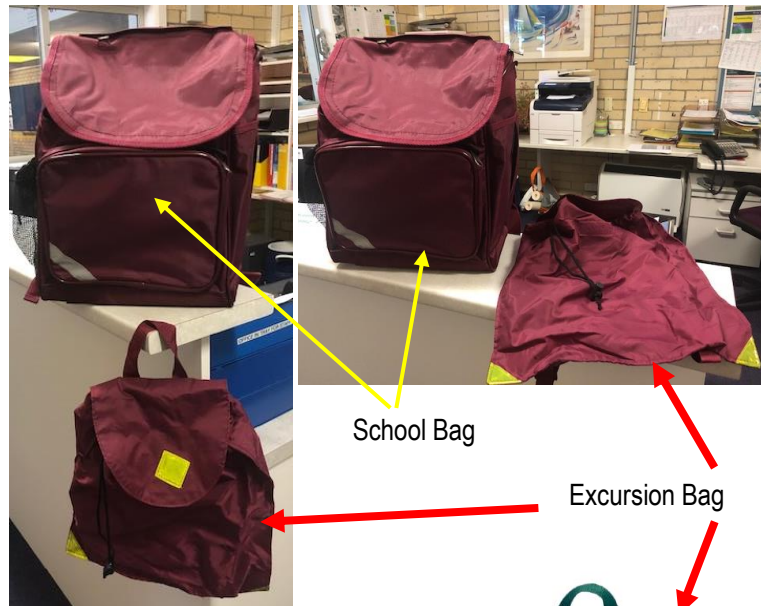
