Remote Learning

In preparation for all possibilities due to COVID-19, the school is looking at ways we can continue the Arranounbai experience through remote learning. This is unchartered



territory for our school and something that continues to develop and I will make provisions for when deemed necessary. I have provided a link to the Department of Education's information to parents and carers, detailing your role if this scenario arises. However, this path is a little different for our school community and will have a variety of challenges along the way. The first challenge of course becomes access: access to the internet and to a device. We are currently looking at using a webbased forum for teaching materials and providing all students with a school iPad (on loan) during the duration of any school closure. The iPad would have appropriate apps for the students to access. Class teachers would supply a suggested teaching schedule and appropriate resources or suggestions to assist in delivering the desired learning. The aim would be to also provide opportunities to have virtual face to face time at designated times throughout the day to assist with social interactions and wellbeing.
