Phase 1 at Arranounbai

Monday 11th May is a monumental day for Education. It marks the day that schools begin their return of students to face to face teaching. This is a complex process as we balance many moving parts to ensure the safest setting for students and staff, in keeping with Department of Education and Health guidelines. Each school is unique in its context and will be very different.

Arranounbai is able to manage students returning for four days a week rather than just one. Students will have face to face teaching Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Wednesday is a learning at home day for all students.

This model has been constructed carefully to ensure best practice can be established and the highest safety and hygiene protocols put in place. It does not guarantee safety and if you prefer your child to learn from home please let me know. We hope we can move swiftly to five days face to face teaching and regular school routines and thank you so much for your incredible support in these interim phases. Without your support of this process it would make it much more difficult to return to 'normality'.
