## Arranounbai Full Time

Restrictions have also changed for schools. As of Monday 25<sup>th</sup> May, children will return full time to school. So, for the Arranounbai community, that means that Wednesday's will no longer be a learn at home day but face to face at school. Arranounbai will continue to operate as we have in the past two weeks. Morning drop offs will continue with Mrs Black and I greeting students at the vehicle, sanitising hands and taking temperatures before entering school, while parents and carers remain in the car. Pick up will continue with parents waiting in the pool car park and staff delivering students. The additional cleaning regime remains for all high touch surfaces and interaction between classes will be as limited as possible. Safety is our highest priority but unfortunately cannot be guaranteed. Students within the high-risk category can continue to be offered remote learning opportunities, chat with me to plan, if you haven't already.



With a greater number of vehicles dropping off and picking up, it is critical that **<u>everyone</u>** drives slowly. Staff and students are ferrying students back and forth so please don't take any chances. This may mean you need to wait before entering or exiting the pool carpark and wait for staff and students to be clear. Please do not congregate in the carpark, outside your car, you must remain in them. Thank you for your cooperation.
